



During the summer, we held four weeklong immersive camps for talented and motivated jazz students, primarily aged 10 to 18. Through classes, rehearsals, private lessons, and performances, our students honed their skills and explored their talents. Our program, a national leader, is distinguished by daily schedules customized to each student's needs and abilities; routine interaction between generations of musicians, from the very youngest to the most established; and availability of substantial financial aid. All activities took place at Stanford University, with classrooms, venues, dining, and dormitories all in close proximity. Curricula aligned with state and federal standards for arts education.



Among our most beloved annual traditions is the Charlie Parker Memorial Jam. Faculty and students come together to celebrate Bird's life and music, sending a wave of sound from the Braun Music Center courtyard into the cosmos. After the senior musician present — this year it was George Cables — counts off "Now's The Time", a massive rhythm section of pianists, bassists, and drummers plays through the head of the tune twice. Everyone then joins in for 24 bars of simultaneous soloing, followed by two more rounds through the head — all the while thinking about Charlie Parker. Towards the end, everyone plays any unshared musical ideas from the previous week. Without fail, this cacophonous tribute gives students and faculty alike the chance to make a joyful sound while honoring a jazz legend.








# MENTOR FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

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# AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Our after-school programs — Giant Steps for middle school students and Miles Ahead for high school students — provided superior jazz education during the fall and spring semesters (11 weeks per semester). Curricula aligned with state and federal standards for arts education, and each semester ended in a free public performance. All students were required to participate in their school music programs as a condition of SJW enrollment, which created a lot of good will: schools did not see their best talent siphoned off by our programs, and our students brought SJW's best practices back to their schools.

Our vision for the future of jazz is one of equal opportunity and representation for men and women. SJW 50/50 Vision is our initiative to help us get there by engaging the best female professionals to serve as inspiring role models; increasing involvement by talented female students through targeted recruitment and financial aid; and pursuing advances in leadership, curriculum, and educator development.



**HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE YEAR:** 

- 21% of camp students were female
- All Jazz Camp students participated in a workshop on racial and gender stereotypes in jazz
- 36 summer faculty members were female a record!
- 50% of Giant Steps Day Camp faculty were female
- All female students who requested financial aid received financial aid
- 10 of 26 Festival concerts featured female headliners
- Each camp week included a faculty roundtable on classroom practices



In spring 2017, longtime donor Bonnie Rattner created a fund to support advanced female students. The Bonnie G. Rattner Family Scholarship will be awarded annually for ten years.


