

Whether you have no jazz experience at all, or you're looking for an immersive jazz program designed to get you to the next level, the safe and supportive environment of the Stanford Jazz Workshop is the perfect place for you.

### IN-PERSON • ADULT AND ALL-AGES PROGRAMS

Jazz Institute is where musicians of all ages go to get deeper into jazz, spend quality time with some of the greatest jazz artists in the world, and to connect with jazz players from all over the world. Open to adults on a first-come, first-served basis, and to musicians ages 17 and under by audition.

#### IN-PERSON ADULT PROGRAMS

Develop the full breadth and depth of your piano skills in this special weeklong immersion program. Open to adults 21 and over by audition only, this program gives you experience playing in a piano trio with professional bassists and drummers. Integrated with the Jazz Institute and directed by renowned jazz pianist Jeremy Siskind, the program also offers access to master classes from renowned SJW faculty such as Taylor Eigsti, George Cables, Kenny Barron, and many others. A showcase exclusively for Jazz Piano Intensive students will let you put your new knowledge on stage in performance.

#### TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Fill out the financial aid application online when you register.

A \$100 deposit is required, which will be refunded if you are unable to attend due to not receiving enough financial assistance.

Following completion of the registration process, we'll send additional application materials to you that you should complete, sign, and return to SJW, to be received no later than the deadline of April 15, 2024.

The financial aid application consists of the following:

- Personal essay written by the participant
- Letter of recommendation from the participant's band director or instructor
- Signed affirmation that any financial information submitted is correct
- Copy of the first page of the most recent tax return of the participant's family

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis and we will notify you of your financial aid application status by the end of May, 2024.

### GET THE MOST FROM YOUR SJW EXPERIENCE: STAY ON CAMPUS

During Jazz Camp and Jazz Institute, over half of SJW students choose to stay in Stanford housing. Staying on campus while you participate lets you connect to the full range of opportunities that SJW has to offer. All students are invited to attend the evening Stanford Jazz Festival concerts and the after-show jam sessions, where students get to see some of the greatest jazz artists in the world perform — the same artists they learn from during the day. Staying on campus makes the late evening programming easier to access.

Participants ages 13 – 17 stay in Stanford dorms or row houses, which are clean, safe, and very close to our classrooms and concert venues. SJW's meal plan for minors offers flexibility and a range of healthy choices for all meals. Residents stay with students their own age and are supervised by SJW counselors — most of whom are jazz specialists, and love talking about jazz.

Adults stay in dorms or row houses during Jazz Institute, double occupancy only. An optional meal plan for adults is available.

If you're age 17 or under and you're applying for Jazz Institute or the Advanced Package, you must submit an audition recording before your application can be accepted. If you're accepted into Jazz Institute or the Advanced Package, your audition recording will be used for your placement recording, unless you'd like to record another for placement. You can use our convenient online app to help create your recording.

Giant Steps Day Camp participants may do their placement evaluations in person at Stanford University, at a date in June to be announced soon. When you register, we'll send you the dates and details on the placement evaluation process.



## CANCELLATION AND REFUNDS

If you must withdraw your application for a summer program, do so on or by May 1, 2024 to receive a full refund, minus your deposit. If you cancel on or by June 15, 2024, you'll receive a 50% refund, minus deposit. Cancellations after June 15, 2024 will not be refunded.
